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DESIGN FOR TOWER BLOCK FIRE EVACUATION DEVICE WINS NEW DESIGNER OF THE YEAR AWARD

An industrial design graduate who has created a fire evacuation breathing apparatus in response to tower block fire safety concerns has been awarded the £1,500 New Designer of the Year Award. The award was announced at the launch of Week Two of New Designers in London last night.




Rimal Bhatt, a graduate from the University of Hertfordshire and one of the 1,500 emerging talents currently showing their work at the New Designers exhibition, started developing his design following the Grenfell fire in 2017. His respirator mask design is coupled with radio frequency technology that tracks when people enter and exit a building and can also log the number of people still inside. The premise of the design is for it to be low-cost and easy to use, and the Award judges described it as 'a very simple solution to a very current issue.'

The New Designer of the Year Award is the top accolade at New Designers, which runs an Awards programme in partnership with leading design brands and organisations. Other 2019 winners include the New Designer of the Year Runner Up, Jenna Maudlin, a University of Dundee graduate whose *Play.world* interactive playsuit has been designed to try and get kids to be more active by transforming screen time into a full-body experience; Belmond Award-winner Laila Laurel from Brighton University, whose 'a solution for man spreading' chairs reverse the typical seating positions of a man and a woman; and Linda Scerpella from Brunel University, who won the Pentland Brands Award for her motion-graphics plastic pollution awareness campaign.







New Designers is a two-week celebration of the future of design, bringing together emerging talents from over 170 creative courses. Week Two, which runs until Saturday 6 July, brings together 1,500 graduate design talents working in Furniture, Product, Industrial, Spatial Design, Graphic Design, Illustration, Animation, Motion & Digital Arts. The New Designers Awards reward the most creative and forward-thinking talents and in Week Two are presented in partnership with 20 design brands and organisations including John Lewis, The Conran Shop, 100% Design and LEGO. The prizes, which include cash, professional advice and paid work placements, offer graduates vital support as they embark on their creative careers.

New Designers Part Two was officially opened by celebrated homeware and furniture designer, Bethan Gray who commented: 'It is an honour to be asked to open New Designers Part Two. Twenty-one years ago – almost to the day – I won an Innovation Award at New Designers and it launched my career. It is a show that is very close to my heart.'

New Designers takes place at the Business Design Centre, London N1, in two, four-day parts, each devoted to a different set of creative disciplines:

- Week One (which this year ran from 26 to 29 June) covering: Textiles & Fashion, Costume Design, Jewellery &
 Precious Metalwork, Ceramics & Glass, Contemporary Design Crafts, One Year In.
- Week Two takes place until Saturday 6 July covering: Furniture, Product & Industrial Design, Spacial Design and Interiors, Graphic Design, Illustration & Animation, Motion and Digital Arts, One Year In.

Business Design Centre New Designer of the Year

Winner: Rimal Bhatt, University of Hertfordshire, Stand FP74
Title of work: FEBA (Fire Evacuation Breathing Apparatus)

Description of work: A respirator mask design coupled with radio frequency technology that tracks when people

enter and exit a building and can also log the number of people still inside.

Judges' comment: 'A very simple, easy to implement solution to a very current issue. Good to see a very positive and

worthwhile response at a timely moment to a pertinent cause.'

Prize: £1,500, plus £1,000 worth of legal advice from intellectual property lawyers Briffa and a year's free

membership to their Design Protect insurance service.

New Designer of the Year: Runner Up

Winner: Jenna Maudlin, DJCAD University of Dundee, Digital Interaction Design, FP5

Title of work: Play.Suit

Description of work: An interactive play suits to encourage kids to be more active and transform screen time into a more full-body experience. The playsuit comes with an app for parents to use to set goals, track development and

give rewards.

Judges' comment: 'The depth of research Jenna has immersed herself in and the challenge she faced in realising this project was immense. As a designer she covered huge ground from game play to motion graphics. An effective solution to a social need.'

Prize: £500

New Designers One Year In Award

Winner: Katie Putt, One Year In

Title of work: A collection of wall hangings

Description of work: A collection of wall hangings influenced by traditional education posters exploring natural

history and botanical themes.

Judges' comment: 'Exceptional detailed drawing skills representing traditional motifs in a contemporary context, encapsulating memory and narratives. Whilst already a complete package, we look very much forward to helping Katie realize the bigger dreams and potential of her practice.'

Prize: £500 Moo.com credit, one-year free membership for Design Nation, a showcase exhibition at the National

Centre for Craft and Design and £500 worth of online training with the Design Trust.

New Designers John Lewis Award for Design and Innovation

Winner: Richard Blizzard, Nottingham Trent University, Product Design, Stand FP48

Title of work: apt.

Description of work: Adaptable open shelving system that's suitable for all stages in life. Custom framing and easy

slot shelves, apt. is designed for people with busy lifestyles who have an appreciation for quality design.

Judges' comment: 'Flexible living and customisable displaying of possessions.'

Prize: £1,000 to support their design career and an opportunity to visit the John Lewis Design team.

New Designers Sainsbury's Argos Home Award

Winner: Will Hudson, Sheffield Hallam, Product design: furniture, Stand FP61

Title of work: Thea

Description of work: Modular seating incorporating lean thinking, sustainability and British sourcing into a beautiful light and efficient product.

Judges' comment: 'Will presented an impressive portfolio which demonstrated strong design aesthetics across a broad range of products. His modular seating product addresses current consumer needs while maintaining a strong sense of design.'

Prize: £500 prize.

New Designers Kingfisher Design Talent Award

Winner: James Parry, Liverpool John Moores University, Product design and engineering, Stand FP86

Title of work: Servi+

Description of work: An accessible HPV home testing kit that aims to break down the barriers for women to have

smear tests.

Judges' comment: 'This piece reflects a deep understanding of consumer needs and demonstrates a clear solution and function. It gives back empowerment on a taboo subjects, providing a kit that is accessible, user-friendly, intuitive and stress-free. It is also commercial and shows a large long-term potential cost savings across multiple industry channels.'

Prize: £1,000 and social media coverage on Kingfisher's channels.

New Designers Hallmark Studio Award

Winner: Sarah Batchelor, UWE Bristol, Interior Design, Stand VC25

Title of work: Paper Denim Chair

Description of work: A chair that turns waste into resource. The work is created from a mixture of waste paper and used denim, which is shredded, blended with jesmonite and compacted to make a solid chair.

Judges' comment: 'We love Sarah's work because of her innovative and responsible use of materials. Importantly for us, she was an absolute pleasure to meet, truly engaging in all respects.'

Prize: Four-week paid studio placement.

New Designers 'The Conran Shop' Award

Winner: Huw Evans, University of Plymouth, 3D Design, Stand FP38

Title of work: Concertina Collection

Description of work: Chair, pendant shade, side table and table light created using a technique for methodically processing timber so that it can be stretched and made into different forms. These forms become components that have used in different aspects of the furniture collection, such as the seat of a chair of the diffuser from the pendant lampshade.

Judges' comment: 'An Innovative technique that has opportunities in both furniture lighting, and lifestyle products. All these categories are central to The Conran Shop edit. The design has a connection to early designs of Sir Terence Conran. Huw is also passionate and articulate about his design.'

Prize: £3,000 towards career development OR a three to six-month placement/ internship in The Conran Shop's London headquarters.

New Designers W'innovate & Wilko Award

Winner: Joe Deakin, Birmingham City University, Product & Furniture, Stand FP59

Title of work: Embed

Description of work: Range of kitchen accessories designed to utilise lost space within the kitchen environment, such as a knife locking system embedded into counter top and a pop-up salt and pepper storage holder.

Judges' comment: 'A simplistic solution to everyday kitchen safety that also utilises unused space.'

Prize: £1,000 and a two-week work placement at W'innovate with a contribution of up to £500 towards expenses.

New Designers LEGO Award for Playful Creativity

Winner: Katy Thomas, Nottingham Trent University, Product Design, Stand FP50

Title of work: emoshi

Description of work: a product designed to reduce children's stress and anxiety when staying in paediatric wards – helps them to learn how to communicate their emotions.

Judges' comment: 'Katy has designed a creative solution to a real world problem of kids expressing their emotions. Her play experience breaks down the communication barriers between children, parents and carers through the means of play. Katy has also shown a strong understanding of the target group. It's simple! It's feasible! And it's fun! Everything is awesome.'

Prize: A visit to the LEGO headquarters in Denmark and professional coaching from the LEGO Creative Play's Vice President of Innovation.

New Designers Kenwood Appliances Award

Winner: Jack Williams, Sheffield Hallam University, Product design, Stand FP1

Title of work: *Compact food processor*

Description of work: A self contained food processor designed to maximise storage and reduce clutter in small

kitchens whilst not compromising on performance or functionality.

Judges' comment:

Prize: £1,000 towards career development, the opportunity to complete a design project under the guidance of the Kenwood Design office and the opportunity to present this to the Kenwood New Product Development team.

New Designers Belmond New Designers Award

Winner: Laila Laurel, University of Brighton, Stand FP29

Title of work: A solution for man spreading

Description of work: a pair of wooden chairs encouraging reversal of the typical seating positions of a man and a

woman.

Judges' comment: 'A bold, purpose-driven design that explores the important role of design in informing space, a

person's behavior and societal issues of today.'

Prize: A commission to design a product for one of Belmond's distinctive and much-loved properties.

New Designers Joseph Joseph Brilliantly Useful Award

Winner: Ollie Mosley, Sheffield Hallam University, Product Design, Stand FFP1

Title of work: Omos vault stove

Description of work: An electrical alternative to the traditional gas camping stove.

Judges' comments: 'A strong commercial solution to a multi-layered problem. From insight through to branding and

packaging, we were impressed with Ollie's holistic approach and attention to detail.'

Prize: Six-week paid internship at the Joseph Joseph Head Office and £500 to spend on Joseph Joseph products.

New Designers Pentland Brands Award

Winner: Linda Scerpella, Brunel University, Visual Effects and Motion Graphics, Stand VC13

Title of work: *Invisible plastics*

Description of work: A motion-graphics awareness campaign showcasing the beauty of ocean plastics to increase

awareness of plastic pollution.

Judges' comment: 'Linda delivered a professional, thought-provoking presentation alongside demonstrating skills in

a broad range of disciplines. We sensed Linda's hardworking ethos and excitement to learn.'

Prize: Two-month paid placement with Pentland Brands.

New Designers Zizzi Fresh Talent Award

Winner: Phoebe Gale, Manchester School of Art, Illustration & Animation, Stand VC14

Title of work: City in Motion

Description of work: A series of prints, books and book layouts inspired by Phoebe's move from rural Kent to the urban setting of Manchester. The work conveys the heartbeat of Manchester as a dense, diverse and ever-changing city.

Judges' comment: 'We were blown away by Phoebe's passion and energy that came across in her cityscape artwork. It tells an emotional story with energetic line work and layering, and we'd love to wok with her in the future.'

Prize: £1000 and the opportunity to create and install a bespoke piece of art for one of the Zizzi restaurants.

New Designers MADE.COM's TalentLAB Award for Standout Design

Winner: Tristan Hibberd, Kingston University, Product & Furniture, Stand PF55

Title of work: Clip shelving

Description of work: Modular shelving system designed around the natural spring that you get when you laminate

layers of plywood together. Brackets are all inter-changeable/ shelves can be moved around very quickly. **Judges' comment**: 'Clever use of material, flexibility in function, understanding the material's character and

providing an innovative fixing method. Great soft aesthetic-tactile, has the potential to be scaled.'

Winner: Anika Chowdhury, Coventry University, Interior Architecture and Design, Stand FP66

Title of work: *Creative co-working economy*

Description of work: A creative, hybrid co-working hub which brings art and design graduates together from diverse industries and cultures to collaborate and network with professionals in the design industry. The hub includes professional art studios, work hubs with different privacy levels, open plan co-working spaces and meeting rooms. **Judges' comment:** 'Articulate description of her work, strong rationale and reasons for design direction. Enthusiasm was expressed well.'

Prize: Full time Junior Designer position at GES Sheffield office working for blue chip clients in the Aerospace and Healthcare sectors.

New Designers Joseph Stannah Award

Winner: James Seal, Huddersfield University, Product Design, Stand FP32

Title of work: Grace

Description of work: A colostomy bag designed to give holistic approach to ostomy living.

Judges' comment: 'Tackled a difficult subject matter with passion and commitment. He showed empathy, depth of research, resulting in a well-executed end design.

Prize: £1,000 towards career development and a six-week paid placement in the Stannah design office.

New Designers 100% Design Award

Winner: Benjamin Stanton, Sheffield Hallam, Product design & furniture, Stand FP61

Title of work: Oak frame and denim shelving unit

Description of work: Looking to the fashion and textile industry and how we can harness waste that goes into landfill, this work is created from denim waste compressed with bio resin to make corrugated denim boards. These are used as shelves incorporated into the hardwood oak frame.

Judges' comment: 'This product was selected for its commercial viability, and made unique by repurposing of waste material produced by another industry. The judges were impressed with its potential for multiple applications beyond furniture design.'

Prize: £500 Moo.com credit, free membership to Design Nation and The Design Trust Business Club and a showcase exhibition at the National Centre for Craft and Design.
